First Methodist Church of Pleasanton Council Meeting Minutes (Overview), November 12, 2024

Attendees: Dan Barrow (Board Chair), Walt Franklin (Finance Chair), Joett Morrison (HRSTChair), Jeff Barta (Trustee Chair), Jeff Petter (Lay Leader), Rev. Dr. Scott Camp, Guest; Deborah Barrow.

This called meeting was called to order by Dan Barrow at 6:03 pm.

Dan Barrow opened us in the Prayer to the Holy Spirit (Page 329)

Jeff Petter gave a devotional from James 4:13-17

The minutes from the council meetings held on October 8, 2024, were reviewed. Walt Franklin moved to accept the minutes as written, Jeff Barta seconded, and the motion passed. The October 8, 2024, meeting minutes were also published in the November 2024 newsletter.

Jeff Petter stated that the by-laws committee met on Thursday, October 10th, and Dr. Camp attended. Jeff Petter noted the committee is in the teaching mode with Dr. Camp leading.

Walt Franklin stated that Leslie Ricks Faith and Finance column published the latest financial information for October 2024 in the November 2024 newsletter.

Jeff Barta presented the trustee report. Jeff Barta said that he had one of our A/C units serviced by PC Air, replaced the coils, and cleaned the unit, which cost \$1,700.00. He said he purchases HEPA Filters from PC Air for the church A/C units. Dan Barrow provided an update on the repairs to the parsonage, which resulted from a busted water pipe in the foundation. ServePro is handling the restoration of the parsonage. They are removing sheetrock and insulation. A hygienist must check the house for signs of asbestos to ensure the air is clean. The hot water pipe needs to be rerouted (this will be done at the church's expense) as it was not part of the initial incident. The valves in the master bath will be replaced while they are exposed. The kitchen cabinets were torn out (the door fronts were saved), and the kitchen counter may be replaced. All flooring will be replaced.

Joett Morrison stated that she does not have anything to report however she is looking forward to the retreat and how we will support the Pastor in his 2025 planning.

Jeff Petter said he did not get a response to his request for Lay Readers in the November 2024 Newsletter. He will continue seeking out new people to help with the Liturgy reading.

Dr. Camp discussed the details of our upcoming retreat with his church staff, and council leaders will attend to pray, spend time in the word, set goals for the year, and develop a cost centered line-item budget and a complete calendar for 2025. This retreat is planned for November 14-16, 2024, at the Crocket Hotel in San Antonio. Rev. Tracy will send out an email with the retreat agenda to the attendees. Dr. Camp will present a state of the church at the end of January 2025. Dr. Camp updated that we had 338 in attendance for Friends Day, held on November 10th, and over 70 were saved or dedicated to Christ. Rev. Tracy and Odis White are following up. The church sent a \$1,000 donation to Teen and Adult Challenge for their participation in the Friends Day service. During the F.A.T. men's meeting on November 9th, Dan Barrow reported that the men prayed over Dr. Camp and thanked him for listening to the Holy Spirit for coming here. During the next F.A.T. Men's breakfast scheduled in December, Tommy Jenkin will lead the group to install a suspended ceiling in the children's classroom wing. Dr. Camp stated that Tommy Jenkins plans to lead a Mission Trip to the border in 2025. Dr. Camp also proposed that we hold two church services starting on February 2, 2025. The early service will be more traditional and held at 8:30 a.m., and the later service will be more contemporary and held at 10:30 a.m. Dr. Camp wants us to pray about starting a privately run first-class Christian school for K-5th grades and a Mother's Day out program. Dr. Camp also recommended having a unified budget except for designated specific giving.

Walt Franklin moved that our next church council meeting be held in the parlor on Tuesday, December 10, 2024, at 6:00 p.m. Jeff Barta seconded, and the motion passed.
